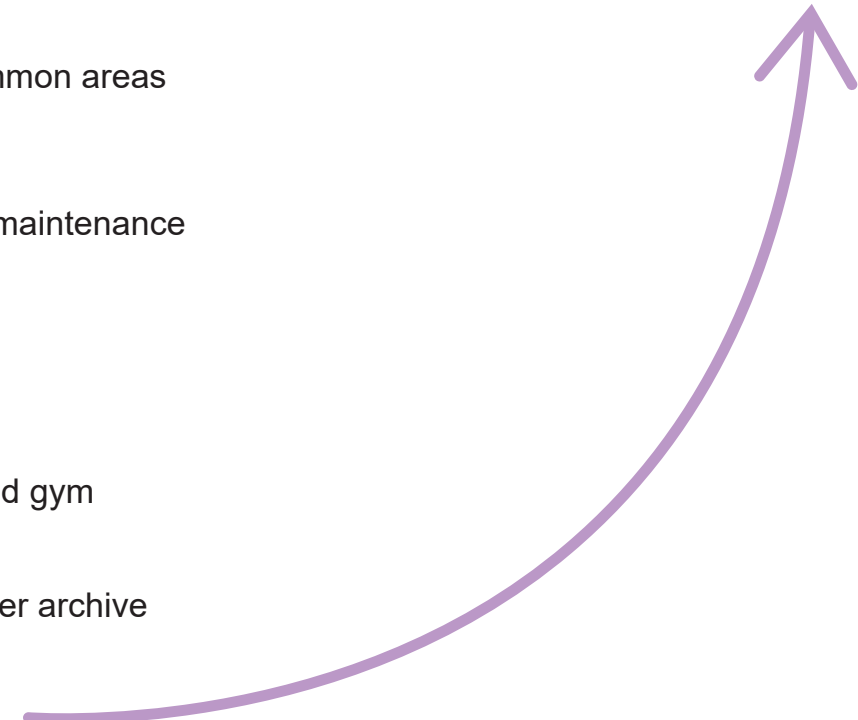
# Services

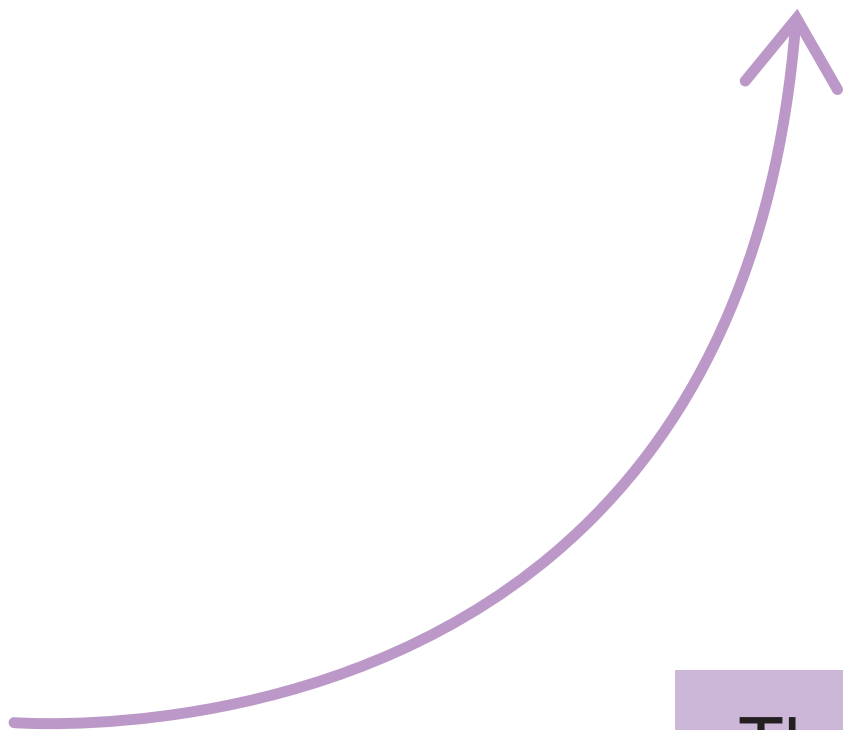

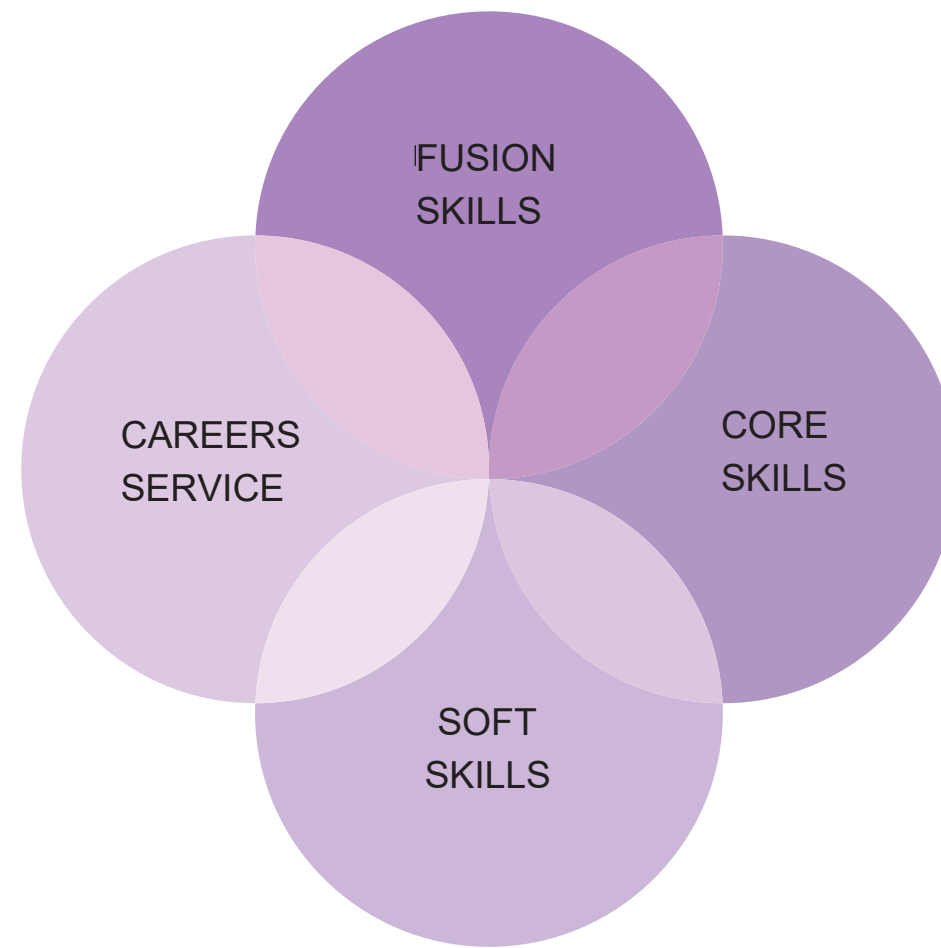


# Education

# Fees

For the services listed in this Prospectus when the Hall is open as indicated in the calendar, the following annual fees apply:

	Single room with shared bathroom	€12,000.00
	Single room with ensuite bathroom	€14,500.00
	Place in twin room with ensuite or shared bathroom	€12,000.00

The amounts indicated are per bed per academic year. For twin rooms, the fee is for each student. Further information will be posted in the Hall section of the Foundation's website ([www.fondazionesancarlo.it/collegio](http://www.fondazionesancarlo.it/collegio)) and may be requested by sending an email to [collegio@fondazionesancarlo.it](mailto:collegio@fondazionesancarlo.it) or by calling (+39) 059 421222 (between 9 am and 7 pm, Mondays to Fridays).

## Fee reductions

Merit-based fee reductions are available.





### Fee reductions through INPS

Under an agreement with Fondazione Collegio San Carlo, INPS provides fee reductions to students who are children or orphans of Government employees and pensioners enrolled in the Unitary Management of credit and social benefits; of retired users of the Employee Management of credit and social benefits; of members of the Masters' Assistance Management and children or orphans of members of the former IPOST Fund Management. The Call for Applications and Application Form will be available from the website [www.inps.it](http://www.inps.it). Beneficiaries will be ranked by INPS, at its sole discretion, which will notify students on completion of the procedures. This benefit cannot be combined with other fee reductions.

N.B. Admission to the Hall must be granted before applying for a reduction, which will not be provided otherwise.



### Fee reductions through ENPAM

As part of the "Quadrifoglio" program of integrated strategic assistance for doctors and dentists, Fondazione ENPAM supports access to the University Colleges of Merit through a subsidy reserved for the children and wards of its members, paid directly to the Hall as its fees. The Call for Applications and Application Form will be available from the website [www.enpam.it](http://www.enpam.it). Beneficiaries will be ranked by ENPAM, at its sole discretion, which will notify students on completion of the procedures. This benefit cannot be combined with other fee reductions.

N.B. Admission to the Hall must be granted before applying for a reduction, which will not be provided otherwise.

### **F—SC** Fee reductions through Fondazione Collegio San Carlo

The Hall runs a system of reductions in its fees to encourage access and continuity to the collegiate experience, aimed at enhancing academic merit, commitment to the educational pathway and depending on students' financial circumstances. Concessions are awarded on the basis of an ISEE certificate, compliance with academic requirements and participation in the Hall community. The reduction percentages indicated in this Prospectus apply to students currently in residence. For new admissions, the reduction is determined annually by Management based on academic merit, ISEE and availability of funds.

# Scholarships

The Hall runs a system of reductions in its fees to encourage access and continuity to the collegiate experience, in line with its curriculum and its principles of merit, equity and shared responsibility.

These financial concessions are designed as a tool to support students' university career and, at the same time, as a recognition of their commitment to their studies, completion of the academic course and responsible participation in the Hall community.

The allocation of reductions is based on a joint assessment of several elements, including:

- the student's financial circumstances, determined through the Equivalent Economic Situation Indicator (ISEE)
- academic merit, assessed in relation to exam results and the relevant academic credits achieved
- continued attendance, meaning residence at the Hall and active participation in its educational, cultural and community activities.

The Hall considers continued attendance a prerequisite for students' all-round educational pathway and values their contribution to academic, personal and interpersonal growth.

To apply for these financial concessions, students must submit the relevant form and their 2026 ISEE Certificate.

Continued receipt of these reductions is subject to checks made from time to time with regard to the financial and academic requirements set out in this Prospectus. If the requirements are not met in full, the Hall reserves the right to arrange meetings and pathways of support for the student in their course of study and participation in Hall life.

Fee reductions cannot be combined with other financial concessions and are applied according to the procedures set out in the annual Prospectus.

## Criteria for Current Residents

In pursuit of these objectives, the Foundation grants fee reductions to students currently resident at the Hall in the academic year 2025/2026 who are not in receipt of any other scholarships for the current such period. To participate, students must complete the relevant form and present the Combined Declaration (DSU) for the determination of their University ISEE.

These reductions, provided at the sole discretion of the Foundation, are subject to current availability of resources.

Grants are made based on the student falling into one of five bands according to ISEE certificate status, on length of residence at the Hall and on specific requirements of both merit and income.

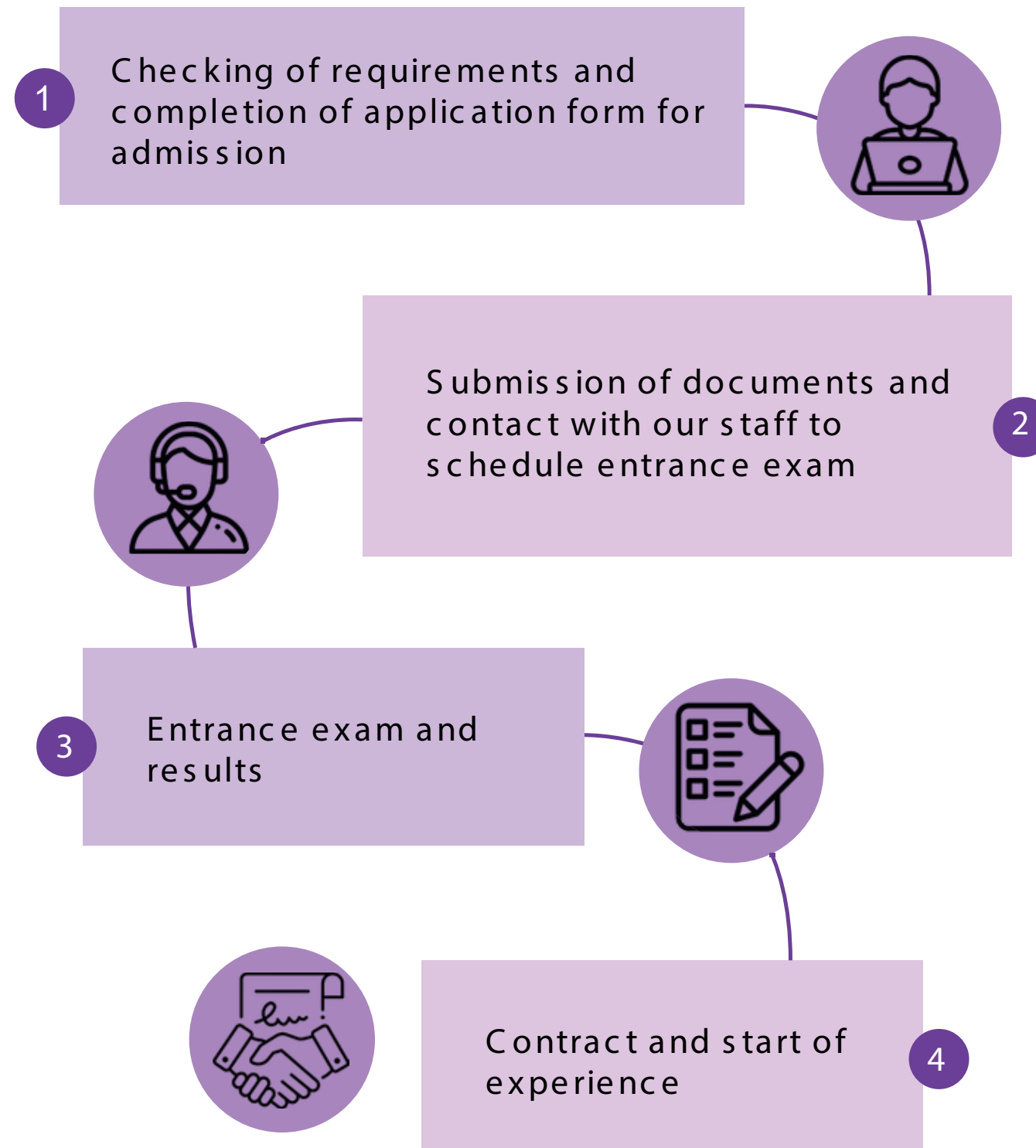
To access these reductions, students must meet the minimum requirement of obtaining at least 42 credits during the academic year 2025/2026 (September 1, 2025– August 30, 2026) with an arithmetic average equal to or greater than 27/30. For students enrolled in the first year of a master's degree in the academic year 2026/2027, the minimum requirement is the achievement of a bachelor's degree grade equal to or greater than 105/110.

This reduction refers solely to rooms with shared bathroom and twin rooms with ensuite bathroom for the use of two students only.

# Requirements for Candidacy & Selection

Students who meet the following minimum requirements may apply as candidates for the selection process:

- for **students enrolled in the first year**, high school diploma or equivalent qualification with a grade equal to or greater than 70/100
- for **students enrolled in subsequent years** enrolment at University or at University -level School and Institutes, following a University curriculum with a weighted average grade of no less than 26/30, having accrued at least 80% of the university credits available during the relevant period
- no illnesses incompatible with community life
- no criminal sentences received or outstanding court proceedings for criminal offenses.

## Application for Admission

Applications for admission must be completed on the relevant online form, available in the Hall section of the Foundation's website ([www.fondazionesancarlo.it/collegio](http://www.fondazionesancarlo.it/collegio)), by September 30, 2026.

N.B. Candidates for an INPS reduction are required to have submitted their application for admission to the Hall before applying for such a reduction, which will not be provided otherwise.

Candidates must also send the receipt for their application to [collegio@fondazionesancarlo.it](mailto:collegio@fondazionesancarlo.it), attaching the following documents (in PDF format only):





Copy of identity document and tax code

Self-certification of their marital status

Copy of their high school diploma (or equivalent qualification), indicating their grade out of 100, or their three-year bachelor's degree certificate

TOLC test results, if required for the course of study

Copy of a receipt confirming registration for admission tests or courses at a University or University-level School or Institute

For students enrolled in years subsequent to their first, a copy of the official certificate of all exams taken with dates and the relevant grades

Passport photo in digital format

Copies of any other attestations or certificates of attendance or supplementary learning (language certificates, European Computer Driving License, diplomas issued by conservatories or academies)

ISEE certification

Medical certificate confirming no illnesses incompatible with community life and indicating any allergies or intolerances

Self-certification of no criminal sentences received or outstanding court proceedings for criminal offenses

Applications for admission must be submitted by September 30, 2026.

### Late Applications

Any applications submitted after the deadline indicated, sent in the same manner as indicated above, will be evaluated against the same criteria. They may be accepted, taking into account the chronological order of delivery, until no places remain available.

### Entrance Exam

The entrance exam will be held on the premises of Fondazione Collegio San Carlo or online on a date set by Management. Candidates will receive an interview date directly from Hall staff. Further information will be posted in the Hall section of the Foundation's website ([www.fondazionesancarlo.it/collegio](http://www.fondazionesancarlo.it/collegio)).

The test includes:

- assessment of certificates
- interview to determine intellectual qualities, aptitudes, interests and willingness to participate in community life
- test to determine level of English proficiency
- completion of a personal statement.

All candidates will receive an outcome of the selection by email within five working days.

N.B. For students enrolled in degree programs that require the TOLC test, depending on the outcome of the latter, an additional test may be required to ascertain the candidate's mathematical and scientific knowledge.

## Acceptance of Offers

Successful students will receive email notification of admission, the contract of admission and an indication of the amount of the installment to be sent by wire transfer to the following current account:

within 5 days of receipt of the notification.

At the same time, students must also pay the interest-free guarantee deposit of €300.00 to the same current account. This will be returned to them on leaving the Hall, minus any charges for damage to facilities or for unpaid debts, as set out in the Regulations.

By the same date, students must also pay the first installment of €500.00, which will not be returned if the student decides not to complete the registration process and which constitutes a deposit for the annual fees. Copies of payment receipts must be sent immediately to [collegio@fondazioneancarlo.it](mailto:collegio@fondazioneancarlo.it); at the same time and by the same means, a copy of the signed contract must also be sent, with the original to be delivered directly to Hall Management upon arrival.

Failure to comply with these instructions will result in exclusion from admission to the Hall.

Acceptance of an offer also entails an obligation to sign all the annexes to the contract:

A) Regulations; B) Residential and Educational Services;  
C) Learning Agreement; D) Privacy Policy.

N.B. Registrants for degree programs at Universities or University -level Schools or Institutes with a restricted intake must notify the Hall of the results of their entrance exams within two working days of publication, subject to withdrawal of their offer.



## Requirements for Readmission

Applications for readmission must be submitted by May 31 of the current academic year and will be assessed at the sole discretion of Management with reference to the requirements set out in the Contract and its annexes, including:



academic performance: achievement of a weighted average no lower than that of students enrolled in the same degree course and year of enrolment at the University relevant to the Hall



compliance with the Learning Agreement: minimum of 70 learning hours per academic year for students in the first three years of University and 25 hours for students in subsequent years.



compliance with Hall Regulations.

Confirmation of acceptance of the application will be provided by July 15, 2026 and by July 30, 2026 for students in receipt of INPS grants. The first installment of €500.00 must be paid within five days of the confirmation date. This amount will not be returned if the student decides not to complete the registration process.



## Payment Methods

Fees are divided into four installments, to be paid by the following due dates:



1<sup>st</sup> installment by wire transfer  
to be paid upon confirmation of acceptance



2<sup>nd</sup> installment by wire transfer by September 10, 2026



3<sup>rd</sup> installment by wire transfer by January 1, 2027



4<sup>th</sup> installment by wire transfer by March 1, 2027.

## Contract

Relations between the Foundation and students will be regulated by:

- a special contract that provides tax relief, in accordance with current regulations. Fees paid to Fondazione Collegio San Carlo (a recognized and accredited College of Merit) enjoy benefits in accordance with Art. 1(208) of Law no. 244/2007 - Finance Law 2008 (tax deductions for off-site students). Signing the contract is subject to acceptance of an offer;
- the annexes to the contract: A) Regulations; B) Residential and Educational Services; C) Learning Agreement; D) Privacy Policy.
